

Work-Based Learning (WBL) is a school-based program that allows students to earn school credit for their part-time job. This is NOT an early release program.

What you will want to know:

- You must apply to be in WBL. **Applications are due by Feb. 24, 2023.**
- There is limited room in the program so not everyone will get in the program.
- Acceptance is based on a criteria (CTAE pathway, grades, discipline, attendance, etc.).
- I have a job, or I don't need these classes to graduate are not reasons to get in program.
- Job should be related to their CTAE pathway AND career goal.
- Students should have at least one CTAE course on their transcript.
- Other possible pathways you can take to be in WBL *non CTAE courses*:
 - *Fine Arts student must have completed 3 courses in the same pathway
 - *Advance Academic Pathway students must have completed 3 courses in math, science, social studies, or language arts ONE OF THE COURSES MUST HAVE BEEN ADVANCED PLACEMENT
 - *World Languages student must complete 3 courses in the same language
 As in traditional WBL (with CTAE placements), students are strongly encouraged to have a
 part-time job related to their pathway and career goal.
- You must be on track to graduate.
- The number of periods you are released from school depends on what courses you need to meet your graduation requirements.
- Pathway completers are the only students that can have 3 release periods.
- If you are accepted into WBL, you will be expected to attend regular meetings, complete assignments, and meet all other requirements for WBL. Your grade will be based on your commitment to WBL and how you meet the course requirements.
