Describe the Georgia Creek and Cherokee cultures of the past. Describe the lives and contributions of historical figures (Sequoyah, James Oglethorpe, Tomochichi, and Mary Musgrove) in Georgia history. On a map, identify specific locations significant to the life and times of the Creek, Cherokee, and historical figures. Describe how the Creek, Cherokee, and historical figures lived & used the local resources, and how it compares to where the students live. Give examples of how historical figures demonstrated positive citizenship traits. Identify ways in which goods and services are allocated. Explain how money makes trade easier than barter.
