ELMS Schoolwide Program - Past and Present

Goals:

- Eagles Landing Middle School will increase the percentage of students in grade 8 reading on or above grade level from 66% to 80% as measured by the 2024 Spring MAP Assessment
- Eagles Landing Middle School will increase the percentage of students in math 8 scoring proficient and above on the 2024 Georgia Milestones Assessment from 15% (based on 2022-2023) to 35%
- 3. Eagles Landing Middle School will continue to provide a safe and orderly school climate and culture by building relationships that promote positive student outcomes, implementing policies and procedures to increase student learning, and reducing the number of level 1,2 and 3 offenses by 50%.

- Henry County uses a Balanced Model of Instruction to guarantee success at every grade level to ensure all students are meeting mastery of state standards

How does our school measure student learning and performance?

Henry County Schools strives to set common, rigorous, expectations for academic performance for all students, emphasize self-assessment and growth, provide a basis for accountability and address development knowledge and skills over time. The goal of Henry County Schools is to ensure that every child reaches mastery in all areas. During each grading period, there will be numerous opportunities for students to demonstrate mastery of the standards. Students will have their progress monitored towards mastery of the Henry Teaching and Learning Standards. Students and parents will receive feedback via the report card every grading period as well as continuous communication from individual teachers. Grade reports are made available every 9 weeks, amd parents and guardians have access to the Infinite Campus Parent Portal to monitor grades and progress throughout the school year. Specific grade reporting dates are identified on the Henry County Schools Yearly Calendar. The report card format will vary by grade level.

MAP Test

a computer adaptive test created by NWEA[™] that kids take two to three times per school year. The results
provide teachers with information to help them deliver appropriate content for each student and
determine each student's academic growth over time; <u>Learn more here</u>

Formative Assessments

- Assessments that help inform instruction and next steps
- district created common formative assessment (bi-weekly for ELA, weekly for Math, 8th grade Science & grade Social Studies)
- School created common formative assessments (6th & 7th grade science & social studies)

Georgia Milestones (GMAS)

 a state required comprehensive assessment system spanning grades 3 through high school. Georgia Milestones measures your students mastery of the state standards in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies; <u>Learn more</u>

ACCESS for ELLs 2.0

• a state mandated English language proficiency assessment for Grades K–12. The test is administered every year to help school districts monitor the English language development of students identified as English Language Learners (ELLs)






WHAT IS REQUIRED BY LAW FOR PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT?




