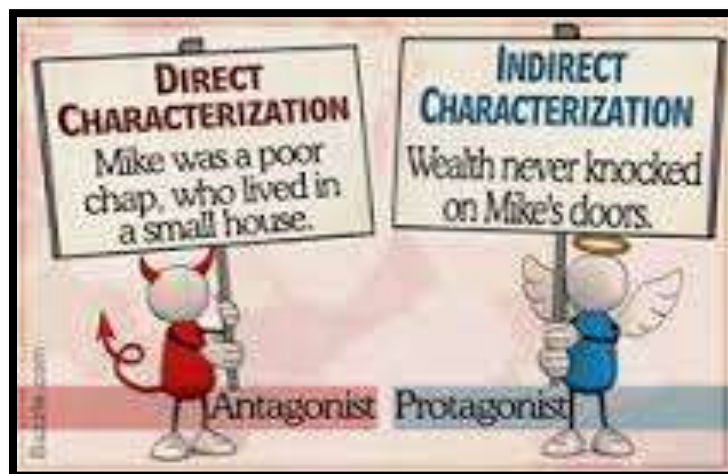


# Characters in a Story

Characterization is the process by which the writer reveals the personality of a character. Characterization is revealed through **direct** characterization and **indirect** characterization.

- **Indirect characterization** – the writer shows the reader what the character is like by revealing appearance, actions, words, thoughts and feelings and reactions of other characters (through observations).
- **Direct characterization** – the author directly states what the character's personality is like. Example: cruel, kind, mean, silly, etc..



- **Protagonist** – the main character of the novel
- **Antagonist** – the person that creates conflict with the character
