## **Complex Sentences**

 one independent clause and one or more dependent clauses combined using a subordinating conjunction.

\*<u>subordinating conjunctions</u> join together a dependent clause and an independent clause

**Examples of Complex Sentences**:

- <u>Although</u> my friend invited me, I did not want to go.
- <u>Until</u> I started to study, I performed poorly on my quizzes.

- <u>Before</u> he was a teacher, Mr. Thomas worked as a detention manager.
- Even though she had a ten-page research paper to write, Mary went to the movies.
- <u>After</u> I Aunt Jakeka's wedding, there was a party.
- <u>Before</u> I was born, my parents got married.
- <u>While</u> we were at lunch, Mr. Thomas was grading our assignments.
- 8.<u>Until</u> you eat, you can't have desert.
