#### **SEVENTH GRADE ELA COURSE DESCRIPTION**

The seventh grade curriculum is designed to ensure scholars' readiness for high school. The curriculum includes richer texts and more challenging and sophisticated writing tasks and projects; additionally, there is a greater emphasis on individual responsibility. During a 60 minute period, scholars work in all strands of the English Language Arts Curriculum under the Georgia Standards of Excellence including: reading, writing, language/grammar, speaking, and listening. To further core curriculum goals, selected novels, articles, poems, and short passages are used to teach each ELA standard. During both semesters the primary focus will be on both Informational Text and Literary Text. Use of personalized learning and differentiated instruction ensures that the needs of all scholars are met.

#### **INDEPENDENT READING**

Our scholars are expected to read, both informational and fictional texts in a variety of genres and modes of discourse, including technical texts related to various subject areas. Additionally, scholars may be required to maintain records of books read using individual book logs and demonstrate comprehension of selected texts through the presentation of individual book projects. Silent reading time may be scheduled in class; however, scholars are expected to read regularly outside of class.

Reading comprehension skills and strategies are also explicitly taught at the middle school level within the ELA class. While engaging in reading mini-lessons, reading self-selected texts, or partaking in individual reading conferences with teachers, scholars develop an appreciation for reading while acquiring the habits and behaviors necessary for academic success.

#### **WRITING**

Scholars write in a variety of informal (journals, class notes) and formal (narrative, expository, persuasive/ argumentative, and technical) modes, for a variety of purposes and audiences. In addition to teaching the form and structure of each genre, writing instruction emphasizes grammar, usage and conventions. Using mini-lessons and writing workshops, grammar is taught in the context of scholar reading and writing.

### **LISTENING, SPEAKING, AND VIEWING**


Expectations for listening, speaking, and viewing behavior are explicitly taught and modeled for scholars. Opportunities to practice these skills may include whole-class and small group discussion, projects, field trips, speakers, oral presentations, scholar-to-teacher conferences, and peer-to-peer conversations. Strategic use of electronic, film, and video resources enrich cultural and media literacy while helping scholars to grow into critically aware consumers and citizens.

#### PERSONALIZED LEARNING

This ELA class will implement elements of personalized learning as a pilot class at ARMS. Specifically, scholars will engage in goal setting, conferencing/progress monitoring, blended learning (using our 1:1 technology), and a focus on learning targets. Scholars will have the opportunity to choose some aspects of their learning and may select from a variety of differentiated assignments (e.g., playlists and choice boards). Even still, all scholars will be taught the Georgia Standards of Excellence which are assessed on the Georgia Milestones End-of-Grade Assessment.
