## **Public Service Recognized**

The leadership and service of board member Dr. Donna McBride was recognized at the December business session. Dr. McBride served as the board member for District 4 from 2014-2018. Since her time on the Board, Dr. McBride has been a staunch advocate for her district and all of its schools and students. Additionally, there has been progress made toward technology enhancements and facility additions and updates. In recognition of her public service to District 4 and the citizens of Henry



County, Superintendent Davis presented her with a commemorative clock. Thank you, Dr. McBride, for your service to Henry County Schools!



## **Retiring After 25 Years in HCS**

Tony Pickett, longtime member of the Henry County Schools leadership team, is calling it a career after 25 years of employment with the district. Mr. Pickett has served in the CTAE department and as a member of the district leadership team, most recently as the Strategic Planning Assistant to the Superintendent. He has served under four different superintendents in his current role.



Superintendent Davis and the Board commended Mr. Pickett for his service and wished him well in his retirement.

## **Security Updates**

Chief Operations Officer Dr. Raymond Bryant got the chance to share with the board and community members the journey the district has been on the past year to enhance the safety and security of our school district. A deep dive into the uncomfortable but important subject started with a roundtable discussion in the spring of 2018 when over 100 participants, consisting of students, teachers, administrators, parents, and local law enforcement, joined together to discuss things that they felt were working well for the district and the things they hoped might change to provide even greater protection for students and staff.

A few short days later, the community came together when hundreds of interested community members heard from a diverse panel of education officials, parents, and law enforcement about some of the things that are taking place in Henry County Schools to ensure safety and how we can all play a part.

Ideas generated by those in attendance have led to many improvements to the security of schools. Some projects were cost neutral while others required funding. Of note, many people will notice that upon visiting a school, each person is required to sign in with proper identification. This is one small step but a huge opportunity to ensure safety of our schools. The board also recently approved funding for the new single-point entry doors for our high schools. This will mirror the single-point entries for our elementary and middle schools. And visitors to middle and high schools will definitely notice that each school now has their own School Resource Officer thanks to a partnership between the Henry County Sheriff's Office, Board of Commissioners, and Board of Education. The entities agreed to jointly fund the costs associated with providing the additional officers for a 1:1 ratio at the secondary schools. We are working on even more projects to ensure everyone's safety and we will be hosting additional community forums in the future.

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#### **No-Cost Commitments**

- All exterior doors will remain locked at all times during business hours (except one front door)
- All interior doors will remain locked at all schools during business hors (i.e. classroom doors)
- Review of Emergency Ready Reference Manual w/ all principals and asst. principals
- Intruder training (lockdown) conducted 2x per year in all schools
- All school and district office personnel will prominently display their ID badges at the school and district office buildings
- All school and staff personnel will address any visitor who does not display a Henry County Schools' ID badge or visitor's badge

#### **No-Cost Enhancements**

- All schools will practice standardized check-in procedures (CheckMate System)
- Update to functionality of CheckMate System to include: 1. Ability to take a photograph of visitors and add a photo to the adhesive badge
- 2. Ability to scan the back of the visitor's driver's license to automatically populate the personal information fields
- Implementation of Social Emotional Learning and Wraparound practices within the school buildings.

#### <u>Investments</u>

- Pilot a Campus Emergency Response System
- Pilot a Buzzer/Key Card System at the newly constructed McDonough High School and McDonough Middle School
- Five additional School Resource Officers (SRO); providing a 1:1 ratio in middle and high schools
- High school single-point entry doors like the middle and elementary schools

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## **Early Literacy Update**

Henry County Schools has been working hard through identified needs found in the strategic priorities to place greater emphasis on early learning and literacy across the district, and the efforts are showing great returns. Part of strengthening our core business of student learning meant we had to clarify what/how we teach, and what/how students learn. There is also the need to clarify which district resources would be used for teachers and student. Mrs. Melissa Morse, Chief Learning & Performance Officer, presented updates to the board regarding the district's work and the success



earned so far. She specifically pointed to the efforts of the district that align with two of the board's beliefs – a belief that each student can learn at or above grade level and will have an equal opportunity to do so, and a belief that effective teachers and leaders produce excellent results. A list of completed and in-process activities include the Henry Teaching and Learning Standards, K-2 Literacy Summit, kindergarten phonics resource acquisition for all schools, and a model for kindergarten literacy instruction at 14 schools. Mrs. Morse was also able to provide information on the district's next steps in their systematic approach to literacy instruction. One of those steps includes the acquisition of additional literacy resources for 1st and 2nd grade teachers. The board did approve the purchase of the resources, and they will be implemented in classrooms starting in January of 2019 and completed in time for the start of the next school year.
