This past week (2/28 - 3/4) we started Unit 6: Geometry = Area and Volume. We reviewed area formulas of the following 2-dimensional shapes: parallelograms, rectangles, squares, and triangles. The students also learned the formula for the area of a trapezoid. We discussed how to apply the shapes and formulas we know to calculate the area of composite figures by decomposing it into familiar shapes.

Next week: We will further our understanding of area and shapes and begin exploring 3-dimensional shapes. The students will learn to identify various 3D solid, the parts, and the nets. The students will also learn how to calculate the surface area of a 3D solid.

Students should have homework for at least 3 days next week.

English

We will continue with the Informational unit this week. We will also be reviewing the elements of a plot diagram. Students will be writing their own fable this week.

** Please encourage your child to read at least 15 minutes a day. This is such an important skill and will be so beneficial for your student.

Reading Support/System 44/Read 180 (Edwards)

 Materials Needed for Class-Students MUST bring earbuds/headphones to class everyday. Due to Covid protocols, classroom headphones will no longer be available. If you have any concerns, please let me know as soon as possible. Students **MUST** have a **pen or pencil** to write with along with a **Composition Notebook**.

- **Student App**-Students **MUST** complete 15 to 20 minutes of their System 44 or Read 180 app in class daily. Students must complete a minimum of 60 minutes per week for a practice work grade. Any minutes over the 60 minutes will be counted as extra credit. The app is only available during school hours.
- Independent Reading-Students MUST read 10 books, e-books, or e-reads and complete the corresponding quiz and pass with a grade of 70 or above. System 44 students can select books related to their topic in the app or by Lexile. For every book they read they must complete a reading log, and then take a quiz on that book. Read 180 students will complete a Quick-Write after they finish their book or e-read and then they will complete a quiz. If students make below 70, they will be allowed to retake the quiz. These quiz grades will be recorded in Infinite Campus. Students should have completed 4 quizzes so far this semester.
- **ReadWorks**-We use ReadWorks passages often in class. Please remind students to complete all ReadWorks passages. The link for each passage is located in Google Classroom. So far, students should have completed the following passages: Why Don't We See Stars in the Daytime; Sunlight in the Night; Does the Moon Really Shine; RainForest Animals; LeBron; A Bumpy Ride; and Solange Knowles.
- **Newsela**-We use Newsela articles from time to time in class. So far, students should have completed the following articles: **Student Opinion: Roblox has many benefits for kids**
- **Missing Work**-Please continue to remind students to check **Infinite Campus** for missing work and not Google Classroom.
- Class Procedures-Please remind students to use the hand signals required in class. Holding up 1 finger means that a student needs to speak to a neighbor, 2 fingers for students mean that they need to get out of their seat to somewhere inside the room, 3 fingers means that students need to sharpen their pencil, 4 fingers means that a student needs to ask the teacher a question. When the teacher raises up 2 fingers and says "2", this means that the teacher is asking for silence. When the students need to use the restroom, they will use the sign for "R". These signals are posted in the classroom above the board.

1) Charged Chromebooks

We are having increasing issues with students coming to school without their Chromebooks charged and ready for class.
