<u>Math</u>

Ms. Jump's and Mrs. Christian's class:

HCS Formative 2 is located in illuminate. This quiz was due 8/20. All corrections to the quiz must be completed by its close date. It will close 9/5 at midnight and will not be reopened. The students were given class time Thursday 8/19 to work on the quiz.

Unit 1 Performance Task - Questions 1 - 4: The first 4 questions were due Friday 8/20. We worked on these together in class Wednesday 8/18. I returned these to the students in class Monday 8/30. Several students were able to make corrections and resubmitted their task. Grades will be posted in IC.

HTLS Quiz - Addition / Subtraction/ Multiplication: This quiz is located in Google Classroom under the Week 3 heading. The students are able to take the quiz twice. The highest grade will be entered into IC. The students completed the Quiz in class Friday 8/27. All attempts are due by Friday 9/11.

This Coming Week - We will be working on long division of multi-digit whole numbers. The students will have an HCS formative 4 quiz in Illuminate Thursday 9/2. <u>The HCS formative 4 will be open for 2 weeks.</u>

**Several Students are not bringing their materials to class.They are losing papers and assignments from day to day. The students need a folder for math. They are able to have their math in a binder with another subject if they choose. But several are digging through bookbags daily looking for work. Please help your students organize their materials and be ready for class. Thank you.

<u>Mrs. Christian's small group class</u>: I sure did miss the kids last week, and will again this week! We will be finishing up multiplying decimals on Monday and we will begin dividing decimals on Tuesday. Please ask your child if they finished the HTLS assignment in class. If not, it needs to be completed and submitted. It can be found in their math google Classroom. Also, please let me know if your child needs extra help. I will be happy to do an evening Google Meet with them to get some extra instruction.

Please encourage your kids to reach out for extra help if they need it. Staying quiet will not help them learn. Since math is a subject where we build on what we have learned, it is important that they grasp what they learn, so they are able to move on and master the next concept.

Social Studies

Ms. Andrews & Ms. Miller:

We completed our unit over Europe Geography. This week we will dive into the culture and languages of certain countries in Europe. Students will focus on note-taking skills and using resources to be a successful student. At the end of the week, we will begin looking at the history of Europe.

Science

Ms. Baus's and Ms. Whisnant's class

We just finished our study of the universe and will now narrow our focus on the Solar System. We will focus on the individual planets and the different groupings that each can fit into. Students will have a quiz and notebook check on Friday. Due to behavioral issues amongst some classes homework may be assigned to keep us on schedule with the district pacing guide for Earth Science.

Assignments will be posted on Google Classroom for any missing students. Some can be made up from home while out, others I will work to help students finish upon return to the classroom.

<u>English</u>

Ms. Justice's and Ms. McBride's class:

This week, we will continue with our narrative unit. Students will be reading a narrative text in class. They will be writing their own disaster poem this week. Students will also be taking an Illuminate Assessment on Thursday.

** Please encourage your child to finish any incomplete assignments at home. Also encourage them to ask questions if they do not understand something. All assignments will be posted in google classroom. The two assignments thus far have been The Artifacts assignment, The Letter to Me assignment, and a warm up assignment from this Wednesday.

** Please encourage your child to read at least 15 minutes a day. This is such an important skill and will be so beneficial for your student.

**We will be going to the Book Fair as a class on Wednesday. Students can bring money any day, and I will allow them time to go to the Book Fair to make their purchases. The Book Fair will close on Thursday. **

Reading Support/System 44/Read 180 (Edwards)

- It's been a pleasure seeing new faces as well as those students that returned from last year! Students in my class are working on improving their reading comprehension, and we will use Lexiles to monitor their progress. Lexiles will help us to determine the grade level your student is reading on.
- 6th grade Lexiles are from 925-1070L/7th grade Lexiles are from 970-1120L
- We will use the following to determine your student's Lexile scores: MAP Benchmark for Reading and the Reading Inventory.
- Once current Lexile scores are determined, students will either be assigned to the Read 180 or System 44 program.
- Students should have also completed the ReadWorks passages called "Racing Cars Can Go" and "Going to the Beach".
