OVERVIEW:

Google Classroom will be used for all assignments.

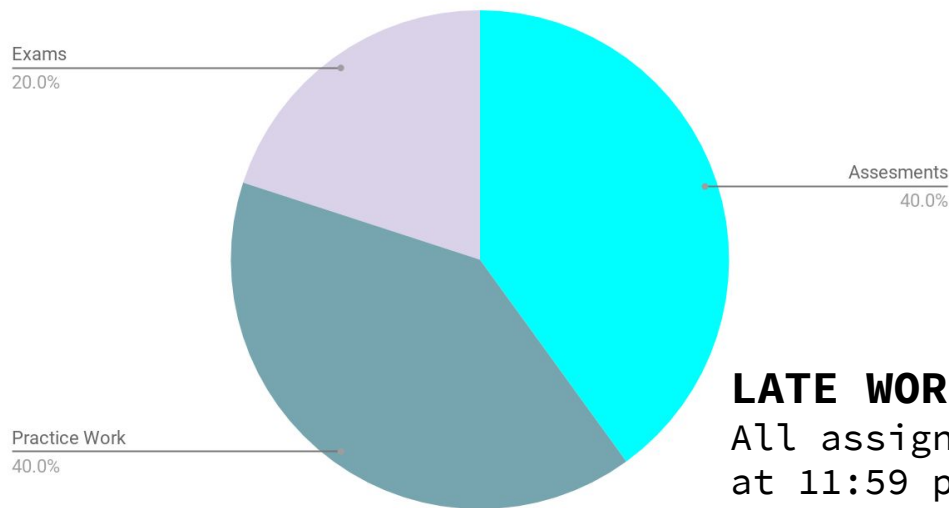
Google Meet will be used for teacher instruction and small group/guided practice. One session will be recorded and posted to google classroom for students who miss teacher instruction.
