What is a Title I School?



A school that participates in the Federal Title I program and receives supplemental funds from the district to assist economically disadvantaged students in meeting the State's high academic standards by providing high quality instruction and learning resources such as technology, intervention supports, and family engagement activities.





How does our school participate in the Title I program?



- Title I is a federal education program that supports low income students
 throughout the nation. Funds are distributed to high poverty schools, as
 determined by the number of students who qualify for free or reduced lunch.
- 2. A Title I schoolwide program is a comprehensive reform strategy designed to upgrade the entire educational program in a Title I school.
- 3. The primary goal is to ensure that all students, particularly those who are low-achieving, demonstrate proficient and advanced levels of achievement on state academic standards.

<u>Student Performance Goal #1:</u> By the conclusion of the 24-25 school year, MCE will Increase the percentage of 3rd grade students reading on or above grade level 62% to 67% as measured by the 2025 Spring MAP assessment.

- •Our school will focus on the following area:
 - K-2nd Grades: Multi-sensory phonics instruction
 - 3rd-5th Grades: Close Reading

<u>Student Performance Goal #2</u>: By the conclusion of the 24-25 school year, MCE will increase the percentage of 5th grade students scoring proficient or distinguished in Mathematics on the 2024 Georgia Milestones End of Grade Assessment from 25% to 30%.

- •Our school will focus on the following area:
 - Develop an understanding of and fluency with solving multi-step word problems using addition, subtraction, multiplication, and/or division

<u>Student Performance Goal #3</u>: By the conclusion of the 24-25 school year, MCE will increase the percentage of students with disabilities reading at or above grade level from: 3rd Grade-20%-30%; 4th Grade-20%-30%; 5th Grade-67%-72%.








What curriculum does our school use?

- Henry County uses a Balanced Model of Instruction to guarantee success at every grade level to ensure all students are meeting mastery of state standards
- 2. In conjunction with the state standards, Henry County Schools ensures instruction alignment with the rigorous Henry Teaching & Learning Standards.







How does our school measure student learning and performance?

Henry County Schools strives to set common, rigorous, expectations for academic performance for all students, emphasize self-assessment and growth, provide a basis for accountability and address development knowledge and skills over time. The goal of Henry County Schools is to ensure that every child reaches mastery in all areas. During each grading period, there will be numerous opportunities for students to demonstrate mastery of the standards. Students will have their progress monitored towards mastery of the Henry Teaching and Learning Standards. Students and parents will receive feedback via the report card every grading period as well as continuous communication from individual teachers. Grade reports are made available every 9 weeks, amd parents and guardians have access to the Infinite Campus Parent Portal to monitor grades and progress throughout the school year. Specific grade reporting dates are identified on the Henry County Schools Yearly Calendar. The report card format will vary by grade level.

MAP Test

A computer adaptive test created by NWEA™ that kids take two to three times per school year. The results
provide teachers with information to help them deliver appropriate content for each student and
determine each student's academic growth over time.; <u>Learn more here</u>

Formative Assessments

- An **assessment** process used by teachers and students during instruction that provides feedback to adjust ongoing teaching and learning with the goals of improving students' achievement of intended instructional outcomes.
- i.e. common formative assessment (weekly/biweekly)

Georgia Milestones (GMAS)

a state required comprehensive assessment system spanning grades 3 through high school. Georgia
 Milestones measures your students mastery of the state standards in English Language Arts, Mathematics,
 Science, and Social Studies; Learn more

ACCESS for ELLs 2.0

• a state mandated English language proficiency assessment for Grades K–12. The test is administered every year to help school districts monitor the English language development of students identified as English Language Learners (ELLs)






WHAT IS REQUIRED BY LAW FOR PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT?

Title I requires that all Title I schools ensure that all parents and families are given the opportunity for meaningful consultation and full participation in their child's education. In this, at a minimum parents are provided with:

- A School-Parent Compact jointly developed with school staff
- A School Parent and Family Engagement Plan
- A District Parent and Family Engagement Plan
- Multiple opportunities for input throughout the year
- The Parents Right-to-Know (professional qualifications of instructional staff)
- Information about the school Title I program
- Information about their child's curriculum, academic expectations, and progress
- Access to and communication with staff according to school procedure and board policies




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
