Course Description: Students will cover a wide range of health related topics that will foster personal, mental, and emotional health.

Course Outline and Content: Making Healthful Choices, Nutrition, Managing Stress, Tobacco, Alcohol, Illegal Drugs, Sexually Transmitted Diseases, HIV/Aids, ADAP, Safety and Well Being, and Choosing the Best Journey.

Special Assignments and Projects: There may be small projects throughout the semester with ample notice given as to due dates.

Classroom Rules and Discipline Procedures: All students must adhere to the rules and expectations outlined in the Henry County Schools student handbook and the Union Grove High School student handbook addendum.

- 1. When the tardy bell rings, be in your **assigned** seat.
- 2. Come prepared. Bring a notebook, pencil, pen, textbook and agenda every day.
- 3. Take care of all personal business (bathroom, water, etc.) before or after class. There will be no passes out of class during the first and last 15 minutes of class.
- 4. Food, drinks and gum are not allowed in the classroom.
- 5. No electronic devices other than Chromebook (see cell phone and electronic device policy).
- 6. Keep the area around your desk neat and clean. Put any trash (no matter how small) in the trash can.



7. No writing or passing notes in class. No unrelated homework or reading material is allowed during class.

Hall Pass Policy: Restroom passes will not be given the first 10 minutes or the last 10 minutes of class. Restrooms are open during each class change and are to be used during that time. The student will be dismissed from class only if he/she becomes ill or if circumstances arise which prevent the student from using the restroom between classes or if medical documentation is provided. Student passes will be allocated using our student conductor system. The student conductor system will allow students to log where/when they are leaving the class. Once a pass is approved by student conductor, the student will receive a written pass from the teacher. Students will be limited to one restroom pass per hour. If student conductor does not allow a student to get a pass, no paper pass will be issued. Students are not allowed to take their cell phones with them into the restroom.

Chromebook Policy: It is an expectation for students to have their charged Chromebook with them every day. Failure to do so will be regarded as "not being prepared for class." **No personal laptops will be allowed.**

Make-up Policy: If you are absent, you should get missed assignments on the day you return. If you missed a test, schedule a make-up time with your instructor. *This is YOUR responsibility. Your instructor will not seek you out to get your work completed.*

Grading System:

40% - Practice Work (notebook checks, written work)

40% - Assessment Tasks (quizzes, tests, and projects)

20% - Final Exam

Cell Phone/Electronic Device Policy: The cell phone/electronic device policy begins when students enter the designated classroom area. All students will place all cell phones/devices in the teacher assigned caddy. During this time, cell phones must be turned off. Additionally, all smart watches or other electronic devices connected to the phone must be caddied until the end of class. Cell phones/devices will remain caddied until the end of class. Students will NOT be allowed to take their phones/devices out of the room when they have a hall pass to the restroom, media center, etc. Students will be allowed to use cell phones/devices before first period, during lunch, and during class transition.


On Time Policy: In order to be considered "on time" to class, the student must be across the threshold of the classroom or designated classroom area by the end of the tardy bell.

Exam Exemption: To encourage and reward excellent attendance, each student may earn the right to exempt one (1) spring semester non-state required final exam.
