

Student and Family Responsibilities Conditions for Effective and Efficient Online Learning

As we think about the expectations and conditions for learning at Impact Academy, think about what learning looks like in a traditional learning environment. The conditions below are not unusual or unique. These conditions are consistent with what is a normal expectation in school and are consistent with the Henry County Board of Education Code of Conduct.¹ Since virtual learning is relatively unique, it is important to interpret these conditions for our specific learning environment.

Conditions	Student and Family Responsibility
 Attend: 1. Students should be ready and prepared for learning. 2. The learning environment should be a good space for learning 	 Students and the family should establish a routine and schedule for being present with the required learning tools such as paper/pencil, calculator (when needed), etc. Students should have no distractions such as cellphones, television, tablets, etc.
	 The student should be in a learning space that is quiet and distraction free. The environment for learning should be a place for learning. The bedroom is not a good place to learn. Riding in a car, shopping in a grocery store, at a public event, etc., makes it difficult for students to remain engaged in the learning environment.
	 Daily Attendance Expectations Students are marked present for the day for completing any of the following activities: Attending the live class session(s) (Synchronous Learning Days) Logging in to Henry Connects or Google Classroom AND completing assignments for each course scheduled for that particular day (Asynchronous Learning Days) Students are marked absent for the day If they miss more than 15 minutes of class time for High School Classes. If they miss more than 10 minutes of class time for Middle School Classes. If they fail to complete assignments for asynchronous days by the deadline given by the teacher.
Active: Students should be engaged in learning during the class session.	 Attendance is measured by active engagement in class or monitoring in GoGuardian If it is the expectation of the classroom teacher, the web camera must be turned on and the student in the view of the camera. For cameras that are not working properly, students must notify the teacher and submit an incident IQ ticket. The student responds to class discussions. If the student is logged in but does not respond to the teacher when called upon, the student may be marked absent. If the student is logged in but sitting idle and the student does not respond to the teacher, the student may be marked absent. Students must use their chromebooks during class instruction If the Chromebook is not used, all personal devices MUST be synched to Goguardian for monitoring purposes.

Achieve: Students are expected to complete work and turn it in on time with academic integrity.	 Independent and guided practice work is required to be completed on time. The student risks a lower grade by turning in late work. When submitting late or missing assignment, students must notify the teacher according to the directions on the class syllabus Check the class syllabus for when missing assignments are no longer accepted. Assessments are required and tied to a grade. Assessments must be completed with academic integrity. Assessments that are completed by cheating will be given a zero. Students that are absent on the day of an assessment must see the teacher or class syllabus for making up the assessment. Students MUST be connected to Goguardian for monitoring purposes of assessments. State Assessments (Georgia Milestone Assessments, End-of-Pathway Assessments, etc.) MUST be taken on campus with the district issued Chromebook. Diagnostic Assessments (MAP) is strongly encouraged to be taken on campus
Adult Involvement: The student's adults must be plugged in and prepared to help.	 IA communicates regularly through email. Parents will need to read emails to stay updated with classroom activity. Elementary teachers also communicate via Class Dojo Teachers have limited ability to intervene when a student is not acting correctly while on Google Meet or when a student is not engaging in class appropriately. We may need parents to intervene in these circumstances We have many active parents. Please be aware that teachers are teaching all day and may not be able to answer your questions via text, email or call until after school. Please do not interrupt the classroom instruction to ask questions or clarify a concern. The chain of command should be followed when there is a concern with the student: Communicate with the teacher first to resolve Communicate with Dr. Patterson, School Principal Communicate with District Level Personnel if concern has not been addressed
