

Kinder Classroom Management Plan

Students are expected to follow the NHE rules and procedures outlined in the student handbook.

- **Be Respectful**

- Respect others' bodies and belongings.
- Do not talk while the teacher is talking.
- Be kind and respect others' ideas and cultures.
- Keep your hands and feet to yourself.

- **Be Responsible**

- Clean up after yourself.
- Show your best effort when completing your classwork.
- Walk inside and run outside.
- Keep up with your materials.

- **Be Ready to Learn**

- Take turns and share.
- Use materials and resources appropriately.
- Collaborate with peers kindly.
- Come to school prepared.

Every student will have a monthly behavior calendar that will be sent home to be signed daily. The calendar will reflect the student's behavior for the day. Kinder students will have a lot of modeling of what behavior should look like in the classroom in hopes that the steps below will not need to be started as they are just coming in and learning how to behave positively in the classroom. Each child will be given two verbal warnings before any other consequences occur.

1st offense: Verbal Warning

2nd offense: Verbal Warning, calm down corner if needed

3rd offense: Think Time- either in the calm down corner or another classroom- no point earned for segment

4th offense: Call home to discuss certain behavior being observed- also parent will be informed that the next offense will be a behavior slip- no point earned, calm down corner if needed

5th offense- behavior slip given, call home will be made to discuss, consequence given off options from behavior slip- no point earned for segments affected, calm down corner if needed

Students will be earning their points daily to earn the school wide behavior incentive.

Students can earn up to 10 points a day.

1- Hallway/Restroom

2- Lunch

3-Specials

4-Whole Group Math

5-Small Group Math

6-Whole Group ELA

7-Small Group ELA

8-ME Time

9-Science/Social Studies

10-Recess

Rewards/Incentives:

1. Students will receive a treasure box prize once they get to 10 days of 90% or more of their points. (Days do not have to be consecutive.)
2. Students receive praise randomly in different forms for positive behavior. (stickers, skittle, positive note, etc.)
3. Students will work towards monthly school incentive rewards for positive behavior.

Documentation: Behavior slips will be kept and stapled together. We will also keep a Google Sheet to keep track of individual class data with the names and dates of the incidents.
