Determine the relationship between an object's characteristics and its resulting motion when a force is applied. Determine the best way to move an object based on its characteristics. Identify Columbus Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas as national holidays and describe why each is celebrated. Explain that maps and globes show a view from above.
