PARENT-TEACHER-STUDENT TEAMWORK

My high expectations are the same for your child as they are for mine, but so is the level of love, care, and protection. My classroom is to be a safe place for each of them and I will protect your child with the same dedication as I protect my own.
- If minor discipline issues arise, I will contact you first so that we may work together to help your child correct the issue and make better choices. For major issues, I will contact you and we will include an administrator and counselor to help us.
- You will have access to everything that we are doing in class. You are welcome to join us in class at any time. You may also have ideas or information that would benefit the class and would be a invaluable asset to the curriculum.

CLASSROOM

- Zero Tolerance Policies include but are not limited to: zeros for assignments not being turned in, assignments turned in incomplete, bullying, disrespect for teachers and fellow students. Any of these will warrant a phone call to you so that we can help your child correct his or her behavior.
- Any level of academic dishonesty will receive a zero, a discipline, and a parent phone call. Academic dishonesty can be defined as, but not limited to, the following:
 1. Plagiarized work from any source where credit is not given, including cutting and pasting from a web source, downloading published papers, or printing off web pages and turning them in as work.
 2. Copying another's homework and turning it in as completed by the student, especially when partners or groups were not assigned by the teacher.
 3. Using notes or study guides to cheat on tests or exams.
 4. Copying from another student's test or exam.
 5. Taking pictures of any assessment or taking an assessment
 6. Using AI in any form.

Any cheating will result in a zero for both or all parties involved. Plagiarism will result in a zero on the assignment, assessment, paper or project.
