AP Exam: **Students are expected to take the AP Calculus AB Exam on May14th.** The cost will be around \$94, but subsidies may be available.

Resources: Students will need to bring their Chromebooks and Textbooks daily.

Student Expectations: Calculus is likely to require a substantial investment of time. You should expect to work on calculus every night. One of the best ways to learn anything is to explain it to someone else...study groups encouraged!

Parent Expectations: This is a challenging college-level course, and regular class attendance is essential; likewise, the student must do his or her homework consistently. It is the responsibility of the student to keep up with the presented material. It can become a "mission impossible" to try and makeup neglected work, regardless of the reasons, so please encourage your child to seek help promptly should s/he encounter difficulties. Additionally, students should plan to participate in advisory, afterschool, and weekend practice sessions whenever possible. Some other activities may need to be curtailed in order to make room for calculus during this time.
