What is GKIDS Readiness Check?

The GKIDS Readiness Check is a component of GKIDS, the state mandated kindergarten assessment. and measures how prepared a child is for school - socially, intellectually, physically, and emotionally. Administered during the first six weeks of school, the goal of the GKIDS Readiness Check is to provide information about the skills of students in the following areas:

- English Language Arts
- Mathematics
- Foundation of School Success



What is the purpose of the GKIDS Readiness Check?

The primary purpose of the GKIDS Readiness Check is to highlight knowledge and skills critical for student success in learning and to guide classroom instruction. The GKIDS Readiness Check will provide

information that allows kindergarten teachers to individualize student instruction and meet the needs of all learners.



What types of questions are on the GKIDS Readiness Check?

Instead of questions, the GKIDS Readiness Check is made up of activities designed to allow some flexibility for the teacher during administration. For some skills, teachers may observe student performance during the course of regular classroom instruction. For others, teachers may administer the activities one-on-one, in small group, or whole group settings. There are a total of 20 activities your child's teacher may use to assess the student.



When do students take the assessment?

The GKIDS Readiness Check will be administered in the first six weeks of kindergarten. This six-week window will vary across districts, depending on the start date of the school year. Teachers may administer the GKIDS Readiness Check activities at any time during this window.



GKIDS Readiness Check student reports are distributed at the end of the 1st quarter as the 1st report card.

What can I do to help my student?

Engaging in learning activities with your child at home can help prepare your child for kindergarten. Reading books, talking, playing games, and social interactions all support children's learning and development.

Once your child has completed the GKIDS Readiness Check, your child's teacher will share the results and discuss ways to collaborate in supporting your child's learning and development. The individual student report will summarize your child's performance in Foundations of School Success, English Language Arts, and Mathematics. The report will also detail how your child performed on each of the 20 activities.

What can I do to help my student?

The GKIDS Readiness Check website provides information on the GKIDS Readiness Check and includes videos, resources, and activity ideas to help you support your child at home.
