

Woodland High School French 2 Honors-1615 Course Syllabus 2024-25

In this course students will continue developing proficiency in the four basic skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing French. This vocabulary-rich environment will teach students basic survival skills as well as general cultural information of French speaking countries. Activities include: dialogue, role-playing, culture days, food experimentation, oral presentations, on-line practice (VOCES) and films. Through vocabulary, grammar and cultural instruction the program will increase the student's level of proficiency in **reading**, **writing**, **listening** and **speaking**, and **culture** through meaningful and

engaging contexts. By the end of this course, students will have acquired a basic command of the key vocabulary and structures necessary for limited personal communication as well as an appreciation of the breadth and variety of the French-speaking world. Topics to be included are: Clothing, Parties and Celebrations, Around Town, Travel and Transportation, Where I live, Food and Meals. Due to the nature of this being an Honors level course, each topic will be studied in more detail and extensive speaking and writing practice will be expected.

Teacher Expectations: I expect that you, the student, do the following...


- STORE your phone in the caddy before class begins

<u>School-wide Grading Requirements as follows (SEMESTER grading):</u> Course Final Average:

Final exam/EOCT- 9th- 12th grade level courses- 20%

Practice Work (examples include: homework, classwork, formative assessments) -40% Assessment Tasks (examples: quizzes, summative assessments, major tests/projects- 40%

*Grades for each 9 week grading period should include a minimum of the following: 3 tests in the summative assessment/Test category, 3 labs/quizzes in Lab/Quiz category and 9 Practice grades.

Academic Integrity Policy:

Should it be determined that an academic integrity violation has taken place, the school reserves the right to assign a grade of a zero and submit a disciplinary referral to the appropriate Assistant Principal. NOTE: Language translators (human, online, electronic, etc.) are strictly prohibited except for use as a limited resource tool (i.e. single word translations) in the world language classroom. Their unauthorized use constitutes academic dishonesty. See your teacher if further clarification is needed.

Procedures:

- 1. *Make-up Work*: It is the student's and parent's responsibility, not the teachers, to make arrangements for make-up work. Students should ask their teacher for any missed assignments on the first day they return to school. The number of days allowed to complete make-up work will be determined by the principal or his/her designee. The days allowed to make-up work will not exceed the number of days absent except under extenuating circumstances approved by the principal or his/her designee. Students assigned Out-of-School Suspension (OSS) will be allowed to make-up work upon return to school. The number of days to complete make-up work is commensurate with the number of days of OSS (i.e. 3 days of Out-of-School Suspension = 3 days to make up work missed).
- 2. *Late Work:* Work turned in after the due date will receive 50% credit. Late work must be turned in BEFORE we take the corresponding unit assessment/complete the unit project.
