

Woodland High School French 3 Honors-1633 Course Syllabus 2024-25



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Bienvenue! Welcome to Honors French 3! I am looking forward to a wonderful year with each and every one of you. At this point in your French career, you will perfect many of the skills that you have been acquiring during your previous years of study. With diligent effort on your part, you will become an expert listener, a more highly skilled writer, an observant, self-sufficient reader, and a more confident, fluent French speaker. One of our many goals this year is to integrate these skills within meaningful and engaging contexts. Topics to be included are: Review of Level 2 topics, Daily

routine, Health, Technology, Errands and Places around Town, Giving Directions, Professions, Environmental Concerns and Nature.

<u>N. B: In the Honors 3 class, students are expected to communicate in French; therefore, an emphasis will be placed on extending the students vocabulary and performance through many different projects and presentations in French. Students will also be required to present often in front of their peers.</u>

<u>WHS School-Wide Expectations</u>: To ensure an optimum learning environment, please adhere to the following WHS Non-Negotiables:

- Arrive to class on time
- No cell phone usage (including air pods, headphones, etc.) inside the classroom
- Submit all assignments to the teacher on time

Teacher Expectations: I expect that you, the student, do the following...

## Consequences for misbehavior are as follows using the 4- Step Referral System

1<sup>st</sup> Offense – Warning or Teacher-Student Conference

- 2<sup>nd</sup> Offense Teacher/Student conference and/or Parental Notification
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Offense Parental Notification/ Parent-Teacher Conference
- 4<sup>th</sup> Offense Administrative Referral





<u>School-wide Grading Requirements as follows (SEMESTER grading):</u> Course Final Average:

Final exam/EOCT- 9th- 12th grade level courses- 20% Practice Work (examples include: homework, classwork, formative assessments) -40% Assessment Tasks (examples: quizzes, summative assessments, major tests/projects- 40%

\*Grades for each 9 week grading period should include a minimum of the following: 3 tests in the summative assessment/Test category, 3 labs/quizzes in Lab/Quiz category and 9 Practice grades.

## **Academic Integrity Policy:**

Academic integrity is a fundamental value of quality education; therefore, Woodland High School will not tolerate any acts of cheating, plagiarism, or falsification of school work. Should it be determined that an academic integrity violation has taken place, the school reserves the right to assign a grade of a zero and submit a disciplinary referral to the appropriate Assistant Principal. The school also reserves the right to remove or suspend enrollment in any Advanced Placement/Honors classes as well as Academic Honor Societies.

NOTE: Language translators (human, online, electronic, etc.) are strictly prohibited except for use as a limited resource tool (i.e. single word translations) in the world language classroom. Their unauthorized use constitutes academic dishonesty. See your teacher if further clarification is needed.

## Procedures:

1. *Make-up Work*: It is the student's and parent's responsibility, not the teachers, to make arrangements for make-up work. Students should ask their teacher for any missed assignments on the first day they return to school. The number of days allowed to complete make-up work will be determined by the principal or his/her designee. The days allowed to make-up work will not exceed the number of days absent except under extenuating circumstances approved by the principal or his/her designee. Students assigned Out-of-School Suspension (OSS) will be allowed to make-up work upon return to school. The number of days to complete make-up work is commensurate with the number of days of OSS (i.e. 3 days of Out-of-School Suspension = 3 days to make up work missed).

2. *Late Work:* Work turned in after the due date will receive 50% credit. Late work must be turned in BEFORE we take the corresponding unit assessment/complete the unit project.
