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What is Title I?

Hickory Flat Elementary is one of 24 Title I schools in Henry County. Title I is a federally funded program under Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). It is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging state academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written Parent and Family Engagement Plan. A school qualifies as Title I based on the number of students who receive free or reduced lunches, however, once a school receives the designation of Title I, ALL students and families in a Schoolwide Title I Program (regardless of income) receive the benefits of the Title I program.

Parent and Family Engagement Plan



What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Hickory Flat Elementary will provide opportunities to improve parent and family engagement to support student learning. HFE values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members in order to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This Plan describes the different ways that the school will support parent and family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Hickory Flat Elementary invites all parents and family members to attend Input Meetings, held each Spring and Fall, to review and revise this Parent and Family Engagement Plan, as well as the Schoolwide Improvement Plan, the School-Parent Compact, and the Title I Budget which includes the 1% set-aside for the Parent and Family Engagement Budget. We also ask parents and families for ideas for building staff capacity. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome any time during the school year. The plan is posted on our school website for parents and families to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All feedback received during the year will be used to revise the Plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey (hard copy and online) to ask parents and families for their suggestions on the Plan and the use of funds for parent and family engagement. Any unsatisfactory comments are shared with the District. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this Plan. Hickory Flat Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

After the revisions are made to the Plan for the current school year, it is distributed to each student to take home to their parents and family members as part of our Title I Parent and Family Engagement Guidebook. Parents are asked to sign and return an Acknowledgement Form to confirm that they received it. The Plan is also available in the Family Resource Center (FRC), posted on our website, and presented at our Title I Annual Meeting.

What is Parent and Family Engagement?







Hickory Flat Elementary believes that parent and family engagement means the participation of parents and family members in regular two-way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities including ensuring:

- That parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning.

Hickory Flat Elementary Goals

Student Performance Goal #1

Hickory Flat Elementary will increase the percentage of students reading on or above grade level, according to the CCRPI* Lexile Level, as measured by the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) from Fall 2021 to Spring 2022.

*CCRPI-College and Career Ready Performance Index.

1st grade proficiency is 360L and will increase from 1% to 50%. 2nd grade proficiency is 535L and will increase from 16% to 50%. 3rd grade proficiency is 670L and will increase from 17% to 50%. 4th grade proficiency is 840L and will increase from 20% to 60%. 5th grade proficiency is 920L and will increase from 38% to 60%.

Student Performance Goal #2

75% of Hickory Flat Elementary 1st-5th grade students will meet or exceed their projected growth goals as measured by the MAP English Language Arts Assessment from Fall 2021 to Spring 2022.

Student Performance Goal #3

75% of Hickory Flat Elementary 1st-5th grade students will meet or exceed their projected growth goals as measured by the MAP Math Assessment from Fall 2021 to Spring 2022.

Hickory Flat is Building Parent Capacity



Hickory Flat will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs is made available to families in multiple ways, such as at meetings and workshops, on our website, and in the Family Resource Center. This information will also be available to non-English speaking families upon request.
- Participate in professional development pertaining to family engagement practices and effective strategies for Parent Involvement Professionals to communicate and build partnerships with parents and family members.
- Plan with families to jointly develop a School-Parent Compact that outlines how parents, teachers, and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement.

- Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding what it means to be a Title I school, the role of parents and family members, the Parent and Family Engagement Plan, the Schoolwide Improvement Plan, and the Compact as well as other events and activities by sending phone messages, brochures, flyers, and communicating on social media.
- Build school staff capacity, using the assistance of, and feedback from parents, to educate staff on the value of building ties between home and school. We will focus on strategies to improve communication, work with parents as equal partners, and implement parent programs.
- Provide materials and training to help parents and families work with their children at home in order to improve their children's academic achievement. - Vary the times and days of our meetings and workshops in order to accommodate family schedules.
- Offer workshops as requested by parents and family members from the Title I parent survey and provide them with resources pertaining to topics such as resume writing and job searches, parenting strategies, and educational materials to help further enhance their parenting skills and various educational backgrounds.
- Review and respond to feedback received on annual parent surveys, and well as surveys conducted at various times throughout the year. Parent input, comments, and suggestions are welcome at any time.
- Submit to the District, any unsatisfactory comments pertaining to the Title I Schoolwide Plan.
