She also shouts out **Brian Saunders** for overcoming adversity, working hard, and being a leader on the court and in the classroom!

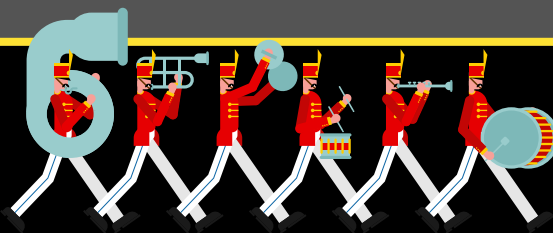
Mrs. Pham gives a shout out to **Corrine Hunter** for being hard-working, smart, and enthusiastic in computer science.

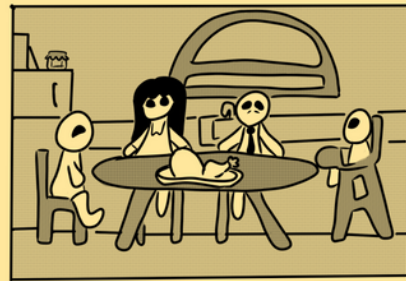
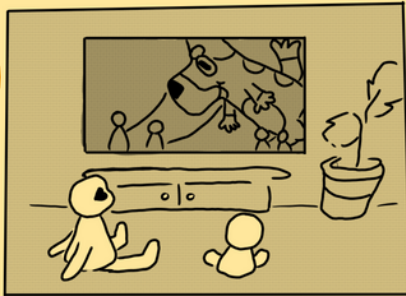
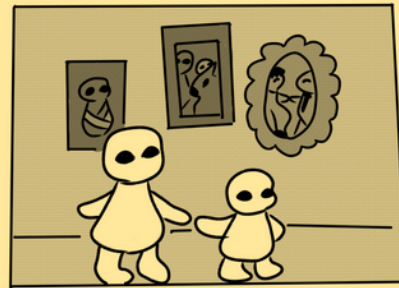
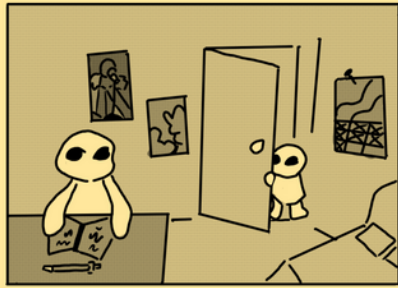
## FLAG FOOTBALL

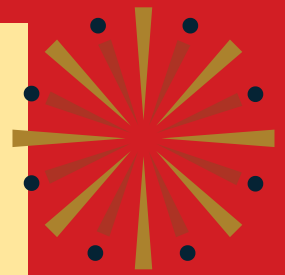
