
The School-Parent Connection

Ways Parents can GET INVOLVED!

Whether you are available on a daily basis or only have a limited amount of time, you can become active in your school's Parent & Family Engagement Program by doing the following:

- ⇒ Learn more about your child's school and the curriculum, special programs, Federally funded programs including Title I and your rights and responsibilities as a parent under these programs.
- ⇒ Attend parent-teacher or student-led conferences, school workshops, meetings to share your opinions regarding your child's learning and progress as well as the school's programs and potential areas of improvement.
- ⇒ Support the academic efforts of your child through goal setting and ongoing progress checks via the Parent Portal.
- \Rightarrow Make decisions about your child's education and academic program .
- ⇒ Develop relationships with and keep in contact with your child's teacher through telephone, e-mail, or face-to-face conversations.

Elementary School

- Create structured routines (morning, homework, bedtime).
- Establish ongoing communication (email, Class Dojo, Remind, etc.) with teachers and school staff to work as a team to advocate for child.
- Participate in school's academic and extracurricular activities such as Parent Workshops and Family Game Night (in-person or virtual).
- Use dinner time to ask child about school. The focus does not have to be academic.
- Serve as a volunteer on various school committees including PTO (if applicable).
- Keep track of child's academic progress by reviewing Daily Folder and Parent Portal.
- Check out games and manipulatives from Family Resource Center to reinforce skills that child learned at school.

High School

- Utilize the summer months to prepare child for high school. Discuss increased responsibilities, course-load, etc.
- Observe child's morning, homework, and bedtime routines. Intervene as needed.
- Continue to monitor child's social media usage and behavior. Remind them of consequences.
- Introduce yourself to all teachers, counselor and the Graduation Coach (if applicable) via email.
- Encourage child to participate in school clubs or extra-curricular activities. Volunteer your time and/or resources for support.
- Continue to monitor child's academic progress via Parent Portal (Infinite Campus). Encourage them to be responsible for seeking assistance. Intervene as needed.
- Visit school's website and social media accounts to keep up with activities, events, and deadlines.

Parent & Family Engagement On EVERY Level!

Parent and Family Engagement is important at every stage of your child's education!

Middle School

- Reinforce morning, homework and bedtime routines. If child is alone during morning and bedtime routines, consider phone and video check-ins.
- Establish limits with social media. Monitor child's behavior during use.
- Meet with or email all teachers (Open House, Curriculum Night, etc.) and establish communication preferences.
- Participate in school's academic workshops and extra-curricular activities (if applicable).
- Encourage dialogue about school with child by asking open-ended questions.
- Seek guidance from teacher or Parent Involvement Professional on academic resources to help child with challenging assignments.
- Establish a timeline on ways to encourage independent behaviors to prepare for high school.
- Continue to keep track of child's progress in Parent Portal (Infinite Campus). Review grades and progress with child weekly.
- Visit school's website and social media accounts regularly to keep up with school activities and events.

Helping Your Child Succeed Academically...in EVERY Subject!

You don't have to be an expert in any subject to help your child.

- Attend your school's Curriculum Night or visit the district's website to familiarize yourself with the Henry Teaching & Learning Standards.
- * Set expectations for homework and daily review of notes.
- Have child explain a concept to you and ask probing questions to determine their comprehension and understanding.
- * Encourage child to have a study buddy that they can contact when they need support.



- * Contact your child's teacher to request resources/websites that can assist you in supporting your child. Don't be afraid to ask the teacher to explain concept to you.
- Visit your school's Family Resource Center or contact your Parent Involvement Professional (PIP) to request additional support/resources.
- * Avoid statements such as "I am not good at Math so you probably get that from me".
- If eligible, make arrangements for your child to attend tutoring with the teacher or school's Title I program.

8 Tips to Help Your Child Focus and Stay Engaged During Remote Learning

- Set a schedule and keep it Establish a consistent night and morning schedule with your remote learner. Use alarms/timers to assist with daily schedule.
- 2. Determine how your child likes to learn—Is your child a visual learning or do they prefer to learn hands-on (kinesthetic)? Find ways to help your child study using their preferred learning style.
- Set up a personal learning space for your child Consider establishing a specific location where your child will participate in Remote Learning daily. Avoid interrupting them while they are in school. Consider headphones if there are multiple learners in the home.
- 4. Utilize Checklists and other Visual Cues—Create a

checklist that your child can utilize daily to stay on task. For younger students, use pictures and other visual cues.

- Connect with the school and teachers—Don't be afraid to reach out to your child's school and teachers for support, guidance, and additional resources.
- 6. Stay Positive—Children often respond to their

parent's anxieties. Make every effort to stay calm and positive, even in moments of frustration.

Facts about Title I

What is Title I?

Title I, Part A is a federally funded program under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The purpose of Title I under the ESSA is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.

Who is eligible for Title I Services?

The program serves students in elementary, middle and high schools who have demonstrated the need for additional academic assistance. **A parent's financial status does not impact eligibility.** Students are identified using multiple criteria including previous year's tests scores, report cards, and teacher recommendations. A family's income IS NOT considered.

Benefits of Title I

Title I provides schools an opportunity to offer additional support and resources to increase the academic achievement of students. In addition to student support, Title I also provides support for parents to assist their child at home in order to increase student achievement. ALL parents of students who attend a Title I School are encouraged to participate in their school's Parent & Family Engagement Program. Teachers at Title I schools also benefit from additional professional development and instructional resources.

How Does Our School Receive Title I Money?

- MYTH—Only low-income students receive Title I Services FACT—Title I Services are based on academic need, not income!
- 1. The **Federal Government** provides Title I funding to each state.
- 2. **State Educational Agencies** send this money to school districts. How much money each district receives is determined by the number of students eligible for free or reduced lunch in the ENTIRE district.
- 3. **Districts** then allocate Title I funds to schools with higher rates based on the number of eligible students enrolled.
- 4. Finally, once funds have been released, Title I schools:
 - Identify the students at their school who need the most educational assistance based on various academic criteria that school has chosen. Students **DO NOT** have to be from low-income families to receive Title I services.
 - Set goals for improving the skills of all students at their school and determine how to utilize their Title I funds to support those goals.
 - Measure student progress to determine the success of the Title I program for each student.

Your Input Matters!

Throughout the year, your child's school will invite you to provide feedback and comments regarding various components of their Title I Program. This includes their Schoolwide Plan, the Parent and Family Engagement Plan, School-Parent Compact, as well as the Title I Schoolwide Budget (including 1% Parent and Family Engagement Budget.

Your input is extremely important as we work together to provide a quality education to our students attending one of our 24 Title I Schools.

PARENT'S RIGHT TO KNOW

You as a parent have the right to request the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teachers and paraprofessionals, including:

Whether the student's teacher-

- has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived; and
- is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification of the teacher.
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

Family Resource Centers

A Family Resource Center is located in each of our 24 Title I Schools. ALL parents of children who attend a Title I school are welcome to visit their Resource Center. The Family Resource Center is designated solely for parents to receive support, training, and access to resources that will assist them in supporting their child. Parents of children who attend a Title I School are always welcome to check out resources, get information from workshops that they may have missed, and even access their child's grades via the Parent Portal. Each school has a full-time Parent Involvement Professional on staff whose primary role is to assist parents. There is no cost involved in checking out instructional support materials. All centers are open during school hours and after hours by appointment.

What is Family and Parent Engagement?

Henry County believes that parent involvement means the participation of parents in regular two-way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, including ensuring:

About our District's Parent & Family Engagement Plan

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, Henry County Schools has developed this parent and family engagement plan that establishes the district's expectations and objectives for meaningful family engagement and guides the strategies and resources that strengthen school and parent partnerships in the district's 24 Title I schools. This plan will describe our commitment to engage families in the education of their children and to build the capacity in its Title I schools to implement family engagement strategies and activities designed to achieve the district and student academic achievement goals.

When schools, families, and communities work together to support learning, children tend to do better in school, stay in school longer and enjoy school more. Title I, Part A provides for substantive parental involvement at every level of the program, such as in the development and implementation of the district and school plan, and in carrying out the district and school improvement provisions. Section 1116 of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) contains the primary Title I, Part A requirements for schools and school systems to involve parents in their children's education. Consistent with Section 1116, Henry County Schools will work with its Title I schools to ensure that the required school-level parental involvement policies meet the requirements of Section 1118 (b) and each include, as a component, a school-parent compact consistent with Section 1116(d) of the ESSA.

Jointly Developed Plan

For the 2020-2021 school year, all Title I parents were invited to participate and provide feedback on the district's and school's Plans during their school's Spring Input Meeting. Parents were invited to all meetings through flyers, emails, text messages, and postings on each school's website as well as their social media platforms. During these meeting, parents received information about the district's Strategic Priorities as well as how the district allocated its Title I funds including the 1% Parent Involvement budget.

Parents who could not attend the meeting were encouraged to submit comments and feedback regarding the Parent & Family Engagement Plan, Strategic Priorities, and Budget at any time on the school's website or to contact the school's Parent Involvement Professional. All feedback received by May 29, 2020 in reference to the district's Parent & Family Engagement Plan was considered. Upon final revision, this plan was incorporated into the CLIP and submitted to the state.

This plan is posted on our district's Title I page under Parent & Family Engagement. It will also be included in every Title I School's Parent & Family Engagement Guidebook.

District Support to Strengthen Our Schools

The district's Title I Parent Engagement Specialist will provide assistance and support to all 24 Title I schools to ensure family engagement requirements are being satisfied and that family engagement strategies and activities are being implemented. Title I schools will receive notifications and resources from the district's Parent Engagement Specialist to help them improve and strengthen family engagement. In addition to frequent communication and school visits, the Title I Parent Engagement Specialist will hold monthly meetings and trainings with its Title I schools' Parent Involvement Professionals and other appointed representatives to review family engagement plans and activities as well as provide guidance with the assistance of parents for Title I Schools to build staff capacity in Parent and Family Engagement.

Additionally, the district's Title I Office will host Annual Title I Compliance Training in July for all Title I Principals, Title I Teachers, Tutors and Title I Parent Involvement Professionals to review parent and family engagement compliance requirements and activities.

RESERVATION OF FUNDS

Henry County Schools will distributed 100% of the total reserved amount of Title I Parent & Family Engagement funds that it received for the 2020-2021 year directly to all of its Title I schools to support their local-level Parent & Family Engagement programs and activities.

The district will provide clear guidance and communication to assist each Title I school in developing an adequate parental involvement budget that supports programs that reach parents and family members at home, in the community, and at school. Each Title I school will host a Parent Input Meeting for parents to provide suggestions how these parental involvement funds will be used at the school-level.

Parent feedback and meeting minutes from these meetings will be reviewed by the school to determine areas of need for the 2020-2021 school year and consider changes to the parental involvement budget.

Building Capacity—Henry County's Mission IS Possible!

Henry County and the Title I Office will take the following measures in order to build the schools' and parents' capacity for strong parent and family engagement that will improve student academic achievement through the following districtwide activities and strategies:



SUPPORT FOR PARENTS

- ★ Sharing vital information to parents of Title I schools on the Georgia Standards of Excellence, state and local academic assessments including the Georgia Milestones, as well as the required assessments for students including assessments for parents of children receiving ESOL services. The dates and locations for these workshops will be posted on the district's Title I webpage as well as the websites of our Title I Schools. Parents will also receive workshop notifications via flyers, email, REMIND, and Infinite Campus.
- ★ The district's Title I Parental Involvement webpage as well as each Title I school's webpage will contain additional information such as parent guides and effective strategies that will assist parents in helping their children at home.
- ★ Copies of these materials will be made available by request for parents who may have limited Internet access as well as those in need of translated versions.
- ★ Collaborating with our local Pre-K, Early Reading & Literacy Programs, as well as participating Technical & Post-Secondary Schools to share school information that will help prepare parents and their child(ren) for transitions into elementary, middle, high, and beyond.
- ★ Ensuring that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is available to all parents in an understandable and uniform format, such as flyers, newsletters and calendars and posted on the district and/or school website. Parent notifications and resources will be sent home in parents' native language, where applicable, and interpreters will be available at parent events and meetings. Information posted on the district Web site will be translated to the extent practicable. The district will also utilize school telephone systems, school websites, local news media, and other school message systems to post information for parents.

SUPPORT FOR SCHOOL STAFF

- ★ Providing ongoing support to Parent Involvement Professionals (PIPs) and Title I Principals in the efforts to communicate and build partnerships with parents. The district's Parent Engagement Specialist will also train appropriate school staff and faculty on creating a welcoming environment and improving school-parent communication.
- ★ Developing partnerships with community members and business leaders to serve as school and district level speakers in order to build staff capacity. The district will encourage collaboration between all stakeholders by posting meeting information on the district's website and share with our 24 Title I Schools.

Opportunities for Meaningful Parent Consultation

All parents and families of students attending a Title I school are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described below. Input and suggestions from families are an essential component of the district and school improvement plans that are developed each year.

School & District Level Parent Input Meetings & Panel Discussions Ongoing, throughout the year

Henry County encourages all parents of children attending a Title I School to participate in their school's Parent Input Meetings and other Panel Discussions. Each Title I School will send home information regarding the date and time of these meetings. Information will also be posted on each school's webpage as well as the district's Title I webpage.

<u>Title I Parent & Family Engagement Input Meeting</u> April 2021—May 2021

All Title I Families are invited to provide input via online surveys on the district's Title I Consolidated LEA School Improvement Plan, the Title I Parent & Family Engagement Plan, and District's Parental Involvement Budget. Notices regarding these input opportunities will be provided to parents in advance using multiple communication methods.

Parent & Family Engagement Annual Evaluation

In the Spring, Henry County Schools will evaluate the content and effectiveness of this Plan for Shared Student Success and the various parental involvement activities to improve the academic quality of the Title I schools through an annual Parent & Community Stakeholder Input Meeting. Our goal is to work with parents and family members to identify barriers to greater parent participation in our Title I schools. We plan to identify specific needs that parents and family members have with supporting the achievement of their children and communicating to faculty and staff. These surveys and feedback forms will also be posted on the district and school websites for parents who are unable to attend.

In addition to the annual survey, each Title I school will also have a Spring Parent Input Meeting to discuss the school's Title I Programs and conduct their own school level evaluation. The results from district forums, Parent Input Meetings and Annual surveys will be used to improve the district and school level Parent & Family Engagement program.

ACCESSIBILITY

In carrying out the parental involvement requirements established by Section 1116 of the ESEA, the District's Title I Parent Engagement Specialist will communicate and collaborate with the Student Services office and Title III Coordinator to ensure full opportunities for participation including providing information and school reports in a language parents can understand to parents with limited English proficiency, parents with disabilities, and families of homeless and children migratory including providing information and school reports in a language parents can understand.



Informing and Empowering Parents

All families of children attending a Title I school are invited to attend Title I meetings and events at the school and district level to share their ideas and suggestions to help the district, schools, and students to reach our student academic achievement goals. The following is a list of sample workshops that will be offered at your child's school or on the district level. For the 2020-2021 meetings will be held in person as well as virtually.

- **Open House and Curriculum Nights**—discover and get connected with the various school and district level resources that are available to parents in Henry County Schools.
- **Principal Chats and "POP-In with the PIP**—come talk to your school's principal or Parent Involvement Professional about specific topics or get information from a meeting that you missed.
- **Georgia Milestones Sessions**—families can hear from educators and each other about ways that they can prepare their child for the state assessments.
- Literacy Workshops for Parents—learn ways to get struggling or reluctant readers back on track.
- Family Game Nights (Math & Science)—participate in content area workshops to learn ways to encourage learning at home while still having fun.
- "Bring Your Parent to School" Day (Middle Schools)—come spend the day with your child to gain more insight on their school day and how you can extend their learning at home.
- **Calling all High School Parents!** attend various forums on specific topics that will assist you in supporting your high school student and their post secondary plans.
- District Family Connections Workshops and Live Parent Sessions Open to all HCS families to learn more about various topics to support the social, emotional and academic needs of their students such as *Tips for Remote Learning* and *Accessing the Infinite Campus Parent Portal*.

Adoption

This district level Parent and Family Engagement Plan has been developed jointly and agreed upon with parents and family members of children participating in Title I, Part A programs as evidenced by the collaboration of parents, school, and district personnel at the annual Parent & Community Stakeholder Input Meeting as well as online comments received by parents via the district's website.
