The School-Parent Compact is an agreement that parents, students and teachers develop together. It explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade level standards.

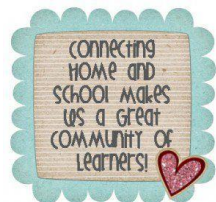
### Effective compacts:

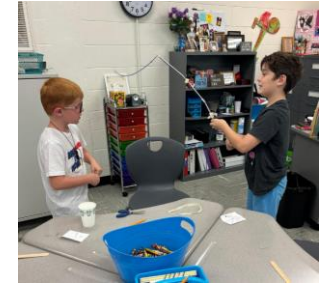

## Teachers, Parents, and Students Together for Success

Every home is a university and the parents are the teachers.

### ***Goals for Student Achievement***

#### **Henry County Schools Priority Student Outcomes to Measure Success:**

1. We will advance opportunities, access, and outcomes for every student group in Literacy Proficiency at every grade.
2. We will advance opportunities, access, and outcomes for every student group in Readiness to Learn at every level.
3. We will advance opportunities, access, and outcomes for every student group in College, Career, and Life Ready Skills - post graduation.

### ***In the Classroom:*** HES teachers will partner with our families to support student success in Reading and Math by:

- Informing Parents of the GSE (Georgia Standards for Excellence) for all grades. The standards are what the state of Georgia requires each grade level to teach. Provide parents with information on reading assessments, scores and levels.
- Monthly newsletters, Dojo posts and Work folders that provide families Math and Reading games and activities to review concepts introduced in class, as well as STEAM activities families can do at home.
- Family Engagement Liaison will share grade level resources via dojo, website that can be used at home to support Math and Reading.
- Teachers will refer families to the Resource Room to checkout resources that support learning at home.
- Encourage families to attend Coffee Chats, Learning Nights offered throughout the year.

### ***At home:*** HES parents collaborated with the staff on ways they can support reading and math at home. Families may add their own ideas and strategies to the list.

- Monitor Assignments in the Parent Portal. Review curriculum being taught in class with their children. Talk about what they feel are strengths and/or areas of need.
- Encourage their child to use the online learning platforms shared on HES and Class websites to practice Reading and Math daily at home.
- Review the class newsletter together monthly and explore the school website for grade level activities to support home/school connection.
- Try to attend coffee chats, learning nights and parent workshops offered by the school. Ask for information if we can't attend.
- Check out resources from the Family Resource Center to support learning at home.

### ***HES Academic Goals/Focus Areas***

1. Increase the percentage of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students reading on or above grade level from 57% to 62% as measured by the 2025 Spring MAP assessment
2. ***Focus K-5:***  
***K-2 Mastering High Frequency Words.***  
***3-5 Mastering vocabulary acquisition and usage in both literal & non-literal text.***
3. ***Focus: K-5:***  
Increase the percentage of students present more than 90% of enrolled days from 80.7% to 85%.

### ***HES Students*** shared their ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach their full potential in Reading and Math. Students came up with the following list of ideas to make the home and school connection a success:

- Take home my work folder each week and discuss what I am learning in class with my family.
- Use Flashcards, Read together, Review math together, help with and review homework nightly.
- Practice Math & Reading at school and home using available online platforms and links on our class/school website. Make flashcards and/or word cards that can be used for review.
- Bring home the class newsletter, Review/Play the games and STEAM activities with my family.
- Ask parents to attend Family Learning Nights and Coffee Chats to help me improve my math and reading skills.
