Course Goals

The goal of the French I course is that the student gains an understanding and appreciation for the French language as well as the culture(s) of the people who speak the language. Within a communicative and creative context, this program will provide the student with guidance to develop proficiency in the four basic skills – reading, writing, listening and speaking.

Prerequisites

There are no prerequisites for this course other than grade-level communication skills in grammar, reading and writing as it assumes that you have minimal or no prior knowledge of the language and culture. The French I course is taught over one year and the primary mode of communication between the teacher and you is in French, with some English translation. (ACTFL Proficiency Guidelines).
