Course Description: High School Transition is a 50-minute class designed to provide students social and emotional skills for a 21st Century learner, support for core content classes, differentiated instruction and mentoring based on each student's personal academic needs.

Course Expectations and Information:

- 1. Students will complete common assignments designed for all HST students that target specific content, study habits, social skills and self reflections. Grades will be earned each week.
- 2. Students should also arrive on time and prepared to work on academic needs such as homework, studying for tests, projects, etc. This is a flexible grouping class, so students may be relocated, reassigned, or regrouped for additional instruction or opportunities to improve learning.
- 3. Students are expected to work without disturbing others.
- 4. Proper use of personal technology (phones, laptops, etc.) is expected. All WHS policies apply! Each teacher holds the right to confiscate cell phones/technology if it is not being stored/used properly.
- 5. Students may not go to another classroom or the media center without written permission from the receiving teacher.
- 6. Individual instructors may add classroom specific expectations in addition to these. Please contact your student's freshman focus teacher if you have questions about the expectations, assignments, grades, etc. in their class.
- 7. Students who do not choose to follow class expectations may be subject to disciplinary action.
