

# Ecology

In ecology and biology, abiotic components are nonliving chemical and physical factors in the environment which affect ecosystems. Biotic describes a living component of an ecosystem; for example, organisms, such as plants and animals. All living things — autotrophs and heterotrophs — plants, animals, fungi, bacteria.
