#### Improving Number Fluency & Using Strategies

- As a school, we will provide parents with an explanation of the GloSS, IKAN, and GMAS assessments as well as resources for parents (i.e. academic calendar) on how to increase their child's math strategy stage. GMAS workshops will be scheduled at the school, after hours, in March and April.
- As a parent, I will ensure my child is completing the monthly academic calendar as well as use the math resources sent home by the teacher. I can attend the GMAS workshops or watch the recordings to gain information on how to support my child.
