

Curriculum Corner

8th Grade Math

The Mathematics 8 classes are continuing the journey through "Number Sense". This is our first unit of study and includes the following topics: Classifying and ordering rational/irrational Numbers; approximating roots on a number line; integer exponent properties; scientific notation; and solving linear equations (containing variables on both sides, with one/infinite/ or no solution(s). We well test out of this unit on September 14-15. A study guide will be available closer to the test date. After fall break, students will complete a Choice Board/Culminating Project to finish the unit. Please provide your child with a TI-30 calculator as soon as possible to help maximize their success through the rigorous activities on our agenda. Math grades are entered into Infinite Campus by standard/topic. In order to achieve mastery, students should be practicing mathematics every night and utilizing various resources provided to them. Thank you for your cooperation!

Physical Science

The Science Department had an awesome time experiencing the Solar Eclipse on August 21st. Students watched this awesome phenomenon while also doing solar eclipse based activities! The Science Fair has kicked off with students choosing their topics and understanding how to conduct a proper experiment. Science is beginning Personalized Learning and students have been given their discovery boards the week of August 28th. Students are buzzing with excitement to begin their learning path tailor-made for them. Students are expected to advocate for themselves and progress through the learning targets in a timely fashion.

Georgia Studies

This year we will take a trip through the history of this great state we call home: Georgia. This year we will cover all of the good, bad, and the ugly that has given us the name the Empire State of the South. In August, we explored Georgia's beginnings through Geography and Prehistoric American Indians. Our next unit will examine exploration of the New World and the creation of the colony of Georgia. English/Language Arts

This year has started out EXCELLENT. From day 2, we have pushed content into our class. The students are becoming well aware of the expectations that we are setting for them. So far, we have covered citing textual evidence, theme, and particular lines of dialogue and incidents that propel action. The students have been very engaged in learning. We have had our first assessment, and students will begin analyzing their own data in order to assist with personalizing their learning. They will be setting goals and referring back to those goals throughout the year to check their progress. Our writing focus so far in the year has been narrative writing, but we are now focusing on argumentative writing elements. Students have been writing daily in class; however, we encourage reading and writing at home. Please check teacher website for additional resources.
